INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

PUBLIC FORUM

Mr. Boone called the Public Forum to order at 5:42 p.m.

WHEREAS, Ms. Suarez in her role as head volleyball coach was instrumental in promoting and supporting female athletics; and

WHEREAS, this community and state are influenced daily by doctors, lawyers, businesswomen, and educators whose lives were molded under Ms. Suarez's tutelage;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the School Board of Escambia County, Florida, recognizes Ann Caro Suarez for her selfless service and contributions to the Escambia County School District and to the community and names the gymnasium at Pine Forest High School the Ann Caro Suarez Gymnasium.
