MINUTES, JANUARY 19, 2016

I. CALL TO ORDER

Mr. Slayton called the Regular Meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. He welcomed everyone in attendance to the regular monthly meeting of the Escambia County School Board and thanked them for their interest in public education.

a. Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

Mrs. Moultrie called for a brief moment of silence followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

b. Adoption of Agenda

Mr. Slayton advised that Florida Statutes and School Board Rule required that changes made to an agenda after publication be based on a finding of good cause determined by the person designated to preside over the meeting and stated in the record. Mr. Slayton said he, as School Board Chair, had determined that the Superintendent's recommended changes to the January 19, 2016 Regular Meeting agenda had been made for good cause. Motion was made by Mrs. Hightower and seconded by Mr. Boone, to adopt the agenda (*as amended*). Motion carried unanimously.

1. PTA Presentation

On behalf of Mrs. Bridgette Brooks, current President of the Escambia County Council PTA (ECCPTA), Mrs. Sally Bergosh, immediate past President of ECCPTA, gave a brief report on the recent and upcoming events and activities of the PTA.

2. Stellar Employee of the Month

The Superintendent made the following announcement: I am pleased to inform you that the Stellar Employee for this month is Susan Jennings. Ms. Jennings has been employed with the Escambia County School District for nineteen (19) years, and during the past ten (10) years, she has been serving at Blue Angels Elementary School as their custodian. Ms. Jennings does an amazing job and is often found assisting wherever the need is greatest. When an employee had surgery and could not return to work, Ms. Jennings stepped in and helped where there was a void left with this employee's absence. She made sure the staff at Blue Angel Elementary School didn't miss a beat and helped to make copies when she could. According to a co-worker, Ms. Jennings is a "quiet soldier" who arrives to work before the rooster crows. She often stays after dismissal making sure the students and staff have what they need. Ms. Jennings is described as quiet, but a powerful influence at Blue Angels Elementary School. Her positive attitude and sweet smile are a welcome sight to staff, to the students, and to the community. Many of the staff members see Ms. Jennings not just as a co-worker, but also as a friend. She is a team player and quick to do anything for the betterment of the team. She is known for her great work ethic, and cheerfully makes the school literally shine. A teacher reported that her portable was cold in the mornings when the students arrived, and when Ms. Jennings heard this, she came in early to turn on the heat so that it would be warm for the children and the teacher. Ms. Jennings personifies the pillars of people and service. It is for these reasons that she has been selected as our Stellar Employee of the month of January. It was noted that Ms. Jennings was unfortunately, unable to attend this meeting; accepting the award on her behalf, was Ms. Karen Montgomery, principal of Blue Angels Elementary. To acknowledge her achievement and recognize her stellar performance, Ms. Jennings would receive a plaque and a pin from the School District and a check in the amount of \$100 from Members First Credit Union.


