I. CALL TO ORDER

Mr. Boone called the Regular Meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

a. Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

Mr. Boone introduced Reverend Walt Magha, Minister to Students at Myrtle Grove Baptist Church. Reverend Magha delivered the invocation and Mr. Boone led the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

3. Stellar Employee of the Month

The Superintendent made the following announcement: I am pleased to inform you that the Stellar Employee for the month of August is Kate Lewis. Kate Lewis is the training and safety manager in the Transportation Department. Ms. Lewis has been with the District 22 years. As you know, Northview High School is the most northwest school in Florida. When traveling out of the area, the track team has to rent vans from the Pensacola Airport to transport the students to their athletic events. The airport is an hour away from Northview. Typically, the coaches rent the vans at the airport and drive back to Northview to get the athletes before they can start the trip. This adds approximately two extra travel hours to an already extra-long trip departing from Northview. Coach Natalie Nall, the cross country and track coach, stated that Ms. Lewis offered to assist the team for the regional (Jacksonville) and state (Bradenton) track meets. As coaches are not allowed to leave their school bus parked at the airport, Ms. Lewis offered to meet the team at the airport and drive the bus back to the compound. After the team returned to the airport she was there waiting with the bus so that students could ride back to Northview in the bus. This reduced the coaches driving time significantly. Ms. Lewis also assisted the team with loading and unloading the athletes' luggage, coolers, and coaches' gear. She even sent texts cheering the team on during the event. Coach Nall stated that by the end of the long travel from the state meet, Ms. Lewis' face was a pleasant treat. Ms. Lewis' sacrifice was a kind gesture to the team. She went out of her way to assist and her kindness is greatly appreciated. She will always be a Northview chief! Kate Lewis personifies the pillars of people" and "service." It is for these reasons that he has been selected as our stellar employee for the month of August. Ms. Lewis will receive a plaque, a pin, and a check for \$100 from Members First Credit Union.
