I. CALL TO ORDER

Mr. Boone called the Regular Meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. He welcomed everyone in attendance as well as those watching via live streaming or television and thanked them for their interest in public education.

Ms. Hightower asked everyone to join her in a moment of reflection. She then led the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

b. Adoption of Agenda

The Superintendent listed all changes made to the agenda since initial publication. Mr. Boone advised that Florida Statutes and School Board Rule required that changes made to an agenda after publication be based on a finding of good cause, as determined by the person designated to preside over the meeting, and stated in the record. Mr. Boone said he, as School Board Chair, had determined that the Superintendent's recommended changes to the July 17, 2018 Regular Meeting agenda were for good cause. Motion by Mrs. Hightower, seconded by Mr. Slayton, to adopt the agenda *as amended*, carried unanimously.

1. PTA Presentation

There was no representative present to provide a report on the recent and upcoming events and activities of the Escambia County Council PTA (ECCPTA).

2. 2017-2018 Fire Life Safety Inspections Recognition

The Superintendent made the following announcement: *The Department of Protection Services* has worked very closely with school administrators to improve safety in the learning environment and in making continuous improvements in fire life safety. All administrators and their staff have dedicated valuable time and effort to reduce the risk of potential injuries and property damage at our

schools. Due to a vast decrease in District-wide deficiencies, we want to recognize those schools that improved the most. Ms. Jennifer Ellis, Manager of Protection Services, Mr. Joe Quinn, Escambia County Fire Marshal, and Mr. John Bartholomew, City of Pensacola Fire Inspector presented certificates to administrators of the following schools: Blue Angels Elementary, Global Learning Academy, Holm Elementary, Pleasant Grove Elementary, Bellview Middle, Ferry Pass Middle, Workman Middle, Pensacola High, Tate High, Suter Elementary, Bratt Elementary, Brentwood Middle, Ferry Pass Elementary, Jim Allen Elementary, Molino Park Elementary, and Brown Barge Middle.

3. Recognition of National History Day Competitors

The Superintendent made the following announcement: In May, more than 60,000 students participated statewide at the Florida History Day State Contest, making Florida one of the largest programs among the 57 National History Day affiliates. Five Pensacola High School students won first place awards at the State contest who then qualified to represent Escambia County this June in the National History Day Competition. The students' presented their entries that took first place at the state competition. The National History Day Contest drew more than 3,000 students from the 50 states, District of Columbia, American Samoa, Guam, Puerto Rico, and international schools in southeast Asia. The 2017-18 theme was 'Conflict and Compromise in History.' After analyzing and interpreting the information they gathered, students expressed their findings in one of the following formats: in a paper, exhibit, performance, documentary, or website. The following five students competed in the National History Day Competition: Parker Beverly in Senior Individual Documentary; Graybill Partington in Senior Historical Paper; Carolyn Hagy and Lauren Hagy in Senior Group Documentary; Max Mateer in Senior Individual Performance. Max Mateer won first place in the National History Day Contest, the only first place awarded to students in Florida, in the Senior Individual Performance category with his entry entitled, "Pushing the Pawn from the Purchase to the Pacific," a play in which Max used the game of chess as a metaphor for the strategic diplomacy of President James K. Polk. Max is an experienced National History Day competitor having won first place in 2017 and fifth place in 2016 while in middle school in the Junior Individual Performance Category. Max also was awarded a National History Academy Scholarship. The National History Academy is a residential camp in Virginia for high-school students with a passion for learning more about the foundations of American democracy.
