    - 1. Student #14-171-221 was found to have committed the following felony offenses: unarmed burglary of an occupied dwelling, obstructing justice, witness tampering and arson. All offenses occurred on or before February 27, 2014. Recommend the Board accept the Hearing Officer's findings of fact and reject the Hearing Officer's conclusion of law on student #14-171-221 and that the Board accept the Superintendent's recommendation for expulsion of student 14-171-221 for the remainder of the 2013-2014 school year and first semester of the 2014-2015 school year.
