Justification for this recommendation was also included in that documentation.) Mrs. Hightower, Mr. Gindl, Dr. Glover, and Mr. Bergosh noted that while this was a very difficult decision, they believed that something had to be done and therefore, they would support the recommendation. Mrs. Stidham wanted additional time to examine the issue further as she many concerns about the effects of the loss of funding on the ten schools listed. She indicated that she would not support the recommendation. Mrs. Hightower noted that she has been assured by staff that the ten schools no longer receiving Title I funding would be "given some support to help them with their short-comings." She requested that the

Superintendent provide the Board with periodic reports on the status of those ten schools. Motion was approved 4 to 1, with Mrs. Stidham voting "No."
