Motion was made by Mr. Boone and seconded by Mrs. Brown-Curry, to adopt Calendar 3 as the 2008-2009 student calendar. Mr. Bergosh spoke in favor of Calendar 1 as it included a 5-day Fall Break (November 24th through November 28th) whereas Calendar 3 consisted of only a 3-day Fall Break (November 26th through November 28th). Mrs. Brown-Curry, Mr. Boone, and Mrs. Hightower each expressed their support for Calendar 3, as they believed it to be in the best interest of high school students by addressing the issue educational continuity throughout each of the 9-week grading periods.
